- Evidence does not demonstrate that the organisation implements an assessment system that ensures all assessment materials comply with the requirements of the relevant training package:
- The observation checklists do not allow for objective feedback from the assessor to the student. The assessor does not document the observations that have occurred in order to deem a learner competent. Sufficient evidence is not gathered from this instrument to substantiate a competency judgement.
